

## Scholarship Committee Report - Henry M. Robert's Day 2025

*“In a galaxy not so far away... the FSAP Scholarship Committee charts its course toward greater transparency and accessibility.”*

Members of the Scholarship Council convened twice this term to bring balance to the Force — or, more precisely, to make scholarship eligibility more accessible, transparent, and user-friendly for all members of the FSAP Alliance. Missions completed and in Process are:

- Performed review and comment on a proposed motion from the Audit Committee to the Executive Board to open a dedicated checking account for scholarships and to designate a CD as “Scholarship.” This initiative will bring new clarity and visibility — much like illuminating the dark side — to FSAP’s financial reports.
- Work is underway on a fillable scholarship application form to be launched on the FSAP website. The goal being that applicants are able to complete and transmit their applications directly to the committee — no droids required.
- Developing a proposed amendment to FSAP Standing Rules that clearly outlines eligibility criteria for scholarships, ensuring that all who seek knowledge may know the path to apply.
- Members are reminded that the scholarship funds are not self-replenishing — they are not powered by the Kyber Crystals of Yavin IV. Contributions from individual members and units are vital to sustain this effort and ensure that future scholars may rise as Padawans of professional growth.




**Pointers on Parliamentary Procedure, available from the NAP bookstore for \$25 is an excellent resource for education programs at unit meetings and for individual study.**



## Annual Meeting

### Types of Annual Meetings:

- Regular Meeting is designated as the Annual Meeting
- Membership Meeting held once a year (board governs other months)
- Business includes annual report of officers and standing committee, elections, and any other business the bylaws may prescribe
- Minutes are approved at the next regular meeting
