

Seventy years ago: The National Association of Parliamentarians conferred upon and guaranteed to the "Florida State Association all rights, privileges, and powers of constituent bodies as are in accord with the bylaws of the grantor." That date was October 1, 1953.

Forty years ago: Mrs. Herberta Ann Leonardy, along with Mrs. J. Bayly Whitney, Mrs. Gus Jackson, Mrs. Alfred W. Neeb, and Mrs. Allen H. Dawson, incorporated the association under the name, "Florida State Association of the National Association of Parliamentarians." That date was February 9, 1983

Eight days ago: The amended and restated Articles of Incorporation were filed to officially change the association's name to the more familiar "Florida State Association of Parliamentarians." That date was May 4, 2023. Now, we really are "FSAP"!

A budget is simply a plan of action for accomplishing the organization's objectives—a plan expressed in financial terms. There is a direct link between the budgeting process and the group's ability to offer programs and services to members. Developing a budget, and then comparing actual financial performance with that budget, is one of the basic tools of effective management. It safeguards
